





# "Support to Armenia-Turkey Rapprochement" Project Call for Applications

## To participate in leadership, communication and problem-solving skills enhancement workshops in Armenia and Turkey

January 2012

This Call for Applications is part of the "Support to Armenia-Turkey Rapprochement" Project supported by USAID. The Project is jointly implemented by a Consortium of four organizations: Eurasia Partnership Foundation (EPF), Union of Manufacturers and Businessmen of Armenia (UMBA), International Center for Human Development (ICHD), and Yerevan Press Club (YPC).

USAID and the Consortium members support Armenia-Turkey rapprochement by facilitating engagement between civil society groups, establishment and development of business partnerships and regional professional networks, and enhanced understanding between the people, for peace and economic integration in the region. It seems that the prevailing approach to problem solving in both countries is the zero-sum game, which needs to be replaced by more constructive modes of group deliberation and cooperative gain models to promote rapprochement process effectively. Successful leadership in both countries for Armenia-Turkey rapprochement requires a new pluralistic political culture with a different set of basic approaches to problem solving.

To contribute to the above-mentioned goal ICHD in Armenia and GAYA in Turkey will select **women leaders** in Armenia and Turkey to offer them a local training workshop in leadership, effective communication, negotiation and conflict management, and trust building.

ICHD and GAYA invite applications from Armenian and Turkish women leaders engaged in business, political and civil society activities to offer them a local training workshop in Armenia and in Turkey respectively. ICHD and GAYA will select up to four groups of women in Armenia and in Turkey and will organize a 4-day local training for each group.

The most successful eight trainees from each of Armenia and Turkey will be invited to participate in a joint 3-day networking workshop. The workshop will serve as an instrument for building a common vision of and shared ownership for the network, as well as a platform for joint planning of future activities.

Members of the network will have an opportunity to apply to the Consortium for grant support to their joint project ideas in different areas.

The working language of local workshops will be Armenian and Turkish respectively. The working language of the joint 3-day workshop will be English.

Participants may represent companies, think-tanks, NGOs, and other organizations in Armenia and Turkey respectively.
